1. Background

- 1.1 On 19.9.2019, the applicant sought planning permission to use the application site (the Site) for proposed temporary public vehicle park (excluding container vehicle) for a period of 5 years (**Plan A-1**).
- 1.2 On 15.11.2019, the Rural and New Town Planning Committee (the Committee) of the Town Planning Board (the Board) decided to defer a decision on the application for two months as requested by the applicant, so as to allow time for preparation of further information (FI) to address departmental comments and public comments. The applicant submitted FI on 13.1.2020. The application was originally scheduled for consideration by the Committee of the Board at this meeting.

2. Request for Deferment

On 14.2.2020, the applicant wrote to the Secretary of the Board and requested the Board to defer making a decision on the application for two months so as to allow time for preparation of further information (FI) to address the further departmental comments and public comments (**Appendix I**).

3. Planning Department's Views

- 3.1 The application has been deferred once for two months at the request of the applicant to allow more time to address departmental comments and public comments. Since the last deferment, the applicant has submitted FI including a revised site layout plan and responses to comments of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation Department, Environmental Protection Department, Transport Department, etc. The current request for deferment for an additional two months is to allow time to resolve the further comments from government departments.
- 3.2 The Planning Department has <u>no objection</u> to the request for deferment as the justification for deferment meet the criteria for deferment as set out in the Town Planning Board Guidelines on Deferment of Decision on Representations, Comments, Further Representations and Applications made under the Town Planning Ordinance (TPB PG-No. 33) in that the applicant needs more time to address departmental comments, the deferment period is not indefinite and the deferment would not affect the interests of other relevant parties.
- 3.3 Should the Committee agree to defer a decision on the application, the application will be submitted to the Committee for consideration within two months upon receipt of FI from the applicant. If the FI submitted by the applicant is not substantial and can be processed within a shorter time, the application could be submitted to an earlier meeting for the Committee's consideration. Since it is the second deferment of the application, the applicant should be advised that the Committee has allowed a total of four months including the previous deferment for preparation of submission of FI, and no further deferment would be granted unless under very special circumstances.

4. Decision Sought

The Committee is invited to consider whether or not to accede to the applicant's request for deferment. If the request is not acceded to, the application will be submitted to the Committee for consideration at the next meeting.
